- Three young adults ages 21-25, one male, one female and one non-binary, regularly going to the pub (at least once a week)
- Two older adults ages 35-50 one male and one female, that go to the pub in the earlier, less busy and quieter hours
- One adult age 25-50 with a physical disability (reduced motor movement)

## A list of prompts appears on the device screen

- Prompt 1: Browse and pick an event that interests you
  - **Prompt 2:** Pick a date and time to reserve a table for an event.
    - o **Prompt 2 follow-up:** How easy or difficult was this task to complete? Is there anything you would change about the process of making the reservation?
  - **Prompt 3:** Confirm the reservation and complete the checkout process (if applicable for the selected event).
    - o **Prompt 3 follow-up:** How easy or difficult was this task to complete? Is there anything you would change?
  - **Prompt 4:** From the home page, figure out where you would go to edit your address.
  - **Prompt 5:** How did you feel about this reservation app overall? What did you like and dislike about it?

- Participants will score the following ten statements by selecting one of five responses that range from "Strongly Disagree" to "Strongly Agree."
  - I think that I would use this app frequently.
  - I find the app unnecessarily complex.
  - o I think the app is easy to use.
  - I need the support of a technical person in order to use this app.
  - I find the various functions in this app to be well integrated.
  - I think there is inconsistency in this app.
  - o I imagine that most people would learn to use this app quickly.
  - I feel confident using the app.
  - o I need to learn a lot of things before I can use this app.
  - The main user flow to make a reservation is clear.
